Please make sure that all applicants are using the new 2016 forms when applying.

All grant applications must be received by the Finance Team by the 10th day of the month prior to the Sub-Regional Trust Board meetings. Please refer to the cal-

Applications for the Q3 meetings held in August 2016 will close on 10 July 2016. November 2016 will close on 10 October.

For elections this year voting will commence in August 2016 and be finalised by the Annual General Meetings held in October 2016. The new Committees and Boards will commence their term in October 2016 and will continue for the two year term to October 2018.


