Cultural Awareness Training Update

Cultural Awareness Training Capacity building has been progressing well with each of the four teams delivering our Initial Training Package to new Rio Tinto employees. So far in 2018 the Initial Training Package has been delivered on 16 occasions, and each team has received lots of positive feedback from the participants.

Our valued casual team members have been an integral part of the successful delivery of Cultural Awareness Training this year. The willingness and ability to come to work at short notice and seamlessly fit into a team is not an easy skill. The casual team members are a critical part of ensuring that Traditional Owners can sustainably deliver Cultural Awareness Training Packages.

Moving forward the team will be even busier during the second half of this year as the schedule expands to the delivery of the required refresher training for all Rio Tinto Weipa employees who are on a shift roster.

The team is holding a workshop at the end of July to enable teams to be comfortable and confident in the delivery of the Refresher Package—Bush Foods.

During this year the team has been working on the content of this package to enable effective and enjoyable delivery and participation by all. During the workshops the team has also taken the opportunity to learn from each other and expand and develop their own knowledge and skills.

By the end of 2018 the Cultural Awareness Training Team will have delivered the Refresher Package to approximately 1000 employees, and the Initial Training Package to 288 new Rio Tinto Employees.

The Cultural Awareness Training Team is also in the process of developing a half day packages for delivery to other employers. This is important work to progress the sustainability of the delivery of Cultural Awareness Training packages to all employees who live and work of the Western Cape.

Educational Bursaries ~ Primary and Secondary

Bursaries are available for Primary and Secondary school students. To be eligible for funding, proof of enrolment and current attendance records must be supplied at the time of application.

Funding can be used to purchase book packs, uniforms, school fees and other school related equipment. School based extra-curricular activities are also covered. Secondary students may also be eligible for assistance with boarding fees and the purchase of a computer.


