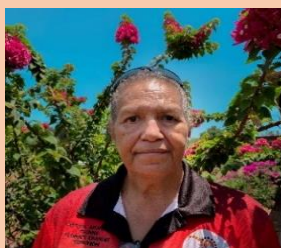
### A SPECIAL MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAIRS

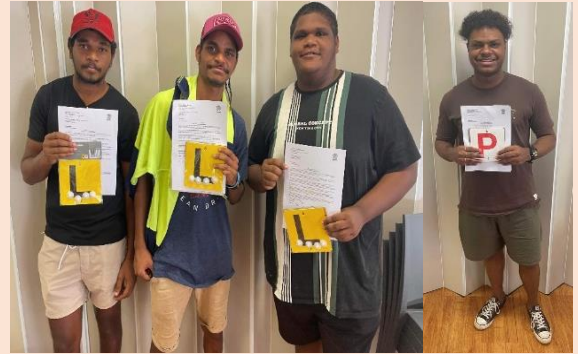

## RIO TINTO UPDATE: ENVIRONMENT AND HERITAGE



### RESEARCH PROJECT UPDATES:

**PALM COCKATOO RESEARCH:** The iconic threatened species of Cape York is part of a comprehensive monitoring program around East Weipa and Andoom. Currently 16 nests being monitored, 9 have in-nest cameras.

**RED GOSHAWK MONITORING:** The Red Goshawk is Australia's rarest bird of prey. The project started in 2015 when a nest was found North of Weipa. There are currently 18 birds being tracked by GPS, 5 of those located at Amrun.

**SPEARTOOTH SHARK RESEARCH:** This project is currently in partnership with the University of the Sunshine Coast and the Mapoon Rangers. The sharks are fitted with small acoustic tags and tracked using an array of hydrophone receivers. This is the largest and longest-running tracking study in Australia.

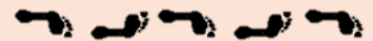

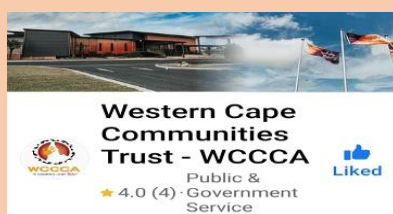
